

Just down Fælledvej from Skt Hans Torv is Nørrebro's only – and curiously appropriate – museum, the **Police History Museum** (Tues, Thurs & Sun 11am–4pm; 25kr), a fascinating, if somewhat macabre, document of crime, detection and incarceration, housed in one of the city's first purpose-built police stations – the infamous Station 6. On the ground floor, the exhibits initially focus on the gruesome methods of social control employed in medieval times, as well as the uniforms and brutal cudgels of the city's early night-watchmen. There are grim old holding cells (in which you can temporarily lock yourself up), and a pair of impressive antique Nimbus police motorbikes, amongst dozens of other exhibits.
